HISTORY

Everything started when a small group of teacher trainers got together to form a professional group. T-PLUS was born then, and it continued functioning as an informal professional organization. T-PLUS organized 10 big events over the period of 5 years giving a chance to ELT professionals to share their experiences.

When T-PLUS grew bigger, and reached around 200 members, it was time to change it to a formal association. For that reason, all the formalities to establish an association were completed and T-PLUS became TESOL in Türkiye.

In the year 2018, the dream about being an affiliate of TESOL International came true. The application process was completed and TESOL International approved TESOL Türkiye as a formal affiliate. Upon receiving this good news, the name of the association was changed as TESOL Türkiye.

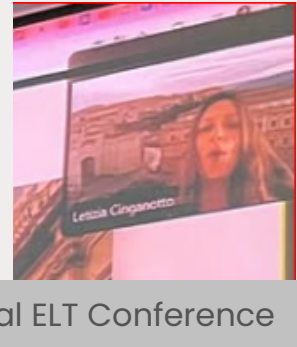
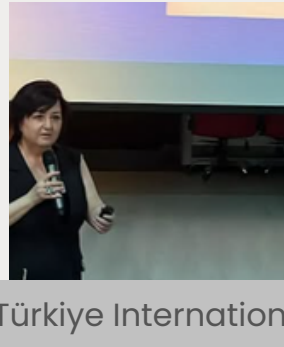

Rather than acting as a simple committee, the ANPC serves as a professional gateway, ensuring that Turkish educators are not only connected to international platforms but are also active leaders in shaping the future of global ELT.



The council's heart lies in its mission to cultivate a warm and robust network of partnerships with national and international associations. This is achieved through genuine outreach and the establishment of formal agreements that allow for a seamless exchange of knowledge and expertise. By working closely with our Special Interest Groups and documenting the best ways to affiliate with global bodies, the ANPC transforms high-level goals into real, everyday opportunities for our members to grow.

Our existing network stands as a beautiful testament to this collaborative spirit. Over the years, TESOL Türkiye has fostered deep and meaningful relationships with a diverse family of affiliates, including TESOL Ukraine, TESOL Spain, TESOL Greece, Nile TESOL Egypt, Kuwait TEFL, HUPE Croatia, NELTA Nepal, ELTA Serbia, CETE/TESOL Georgia, and BETA Bulgaria. These friendships have already produced remarkable results. We still feel the impact of the April 2024 joint conference and the International TESOL Affiliates Summit in İzmir. We are now incredibly excited to welcome our newest partner, BELTA Bangladesh, into the fold. Their arrival brings a fresh perspective from South Asia, adding a new layer of pedagogical insight and strengthening our collective resilience as a global teaching community.

Looking toward the future, we aim to deepen these bonds through initiatives that feel both impactful and accessible for everyone. We plan to host a series of collaborative webinars and regional conferences that bring together diverse voices from every corner of our network to discuss the realities of the modern classroom. To make our collaboration even more practical, we propose launching a Global Materials Exchange Hub. This would be a simple, shared digital space where teachers from all our affiliate partners can upload and download lesson plans, worksheets, and classroom activities tailored to our unique regional contexts.

Additionally, we would like to start an Affiliate Spotlight in our newsletters. This would involve a short, informal interview or a "day in the life" feature from a teacher in a partner association. By sharing these personal stories and practical resources, we can learn from each other's successes and challenges without the need for complex technology or massive time commitments. Through these efforts, the ANPC continues to show that while our classrooms may be local, our professional family is truly global.

The Events Planning Professional Council (EPPC) continued to play a central role in supporting TESOL Türkiye's mission throughout 2025 by coordinating high quality conferences, webinars, workshops, and professional development initiatives. Working closely with the Board of Directors, Professional Councils, and Affiliates, EPPC focused on ensuring that all events were pedagogically relevant, inclusive, and aligned with the association's strategic priorities.



Throughout the year, EPPC contributed to shaping events that addressed current developments in English Language Teaching, responded to the diverse needs of TESOL Türkiye members, and foregrounded innovation, collaboration, and sustainability. The council, composed of ten dedicated ELT professionals working across different institutions and contexts, continued its work under the leadership of Aslı Yılmaz Ercan. EPPC members Esra Yatağanbaba, Tuğçe Temir, Aylin Selin Dewan Türüdü, Songül Tomek, Mehmet Durmaz, Begüm Kut, İlknur Civan Biçer, Mine Bektaş, Neslihan Gözütok, and Pinar Sekmen (Project Reporter) contributed actively to the planning, delivery, and moderation of events throughout the year.

Webinars and Professional Learning Events

In 2025, EPPC coordinated a range of webinars and training activities in collaboration with TESOL Türkiye Trainers and partner councils. One notable initiative was the Revisiting Uncharted Realms Webinar Series, which aimed to explore emerging and underrepresented areas in ELT. The fifth session of the series, held in January, focused on mediation and emergent language in contemporary language classrooms. The session highlighted the shifting roles of teachers and learners, the relevance of mediation within the CEFR framework, and practical ways of creating space for emergent language alongside curriculum goals.

6th TESOL Türkiye International ELT Conference

A major milestone of the year was the 6th TESOL Türkiye International ELT Conference, held on 18–19 April 2025 and preceded by Pre-Conference Events on 17 April. Hosted by the Foreign Languages Education Department at Erciyes University in Kayseri, the conference brought together educators, researchers, and practitioners from across Türkiye and beyond.

Under the theme Future-Proof Learning: Rethinking Education to Inspire and Sustain Tomorrow, the conference emphasized the shift from teaching-centered to learning-centered approaches, learner autonomy, and the impact of technological and social change on education. Grounded in the principles of the Sustainable Development Goals, the event fostered dialogue on building equitable, adaptive, and future-ready learning environments for teachers, learners, institutions, and educational leaders.



Bridging Expertise: A Professional Development Collaboration Program

Running from February to May 2025, the Bridging Expertise Professional Development Collaboration Program represented one of EPPC's most comprehensive and collaborative initiatives of the year. Designed as a hybrid, multi-site program, it combined face-to-face workshops hosted at partner universities with follow-up online sessions, allowing broader national reach while maintaining local engagement.

The program brought together international and local trainers, creating opportunities for cross-contextual dialogue and the sharing of expertise across institutions. In total, five thematically connected workshops were delivered in collaboration with five host universities, addressing key pedagogical areas such as coursebook adaptation, learner engagement, AI-supported teaching, data-driven writing instruction, speaking fluency, and academic language development.

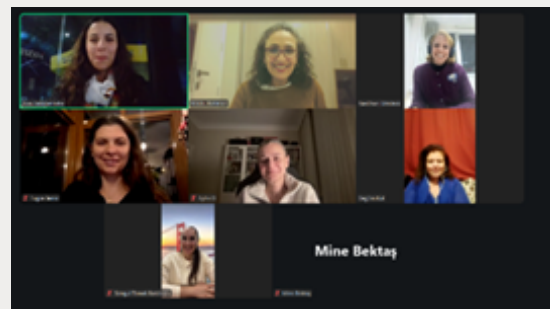
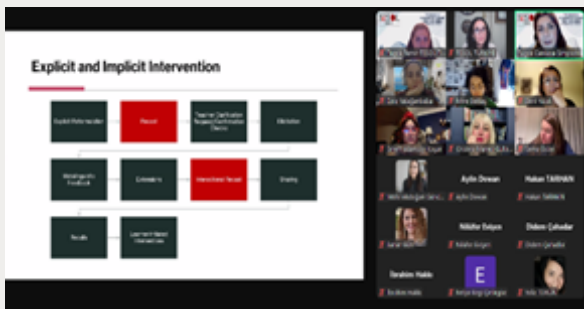

Each workshop was structured to foreground hands-on& classroom-ready practices, encourage reflective and collaborative professional learning, and respond directly to teachers' everyday instructional challenges across tertiary and preparatory programs.

Thematically, the program emphasized teacher agency, flexible pedagogy, and evidence-informed decision-making, aligning closely with TESOL Türkiye's broader vision of sustainable and context-responsive professional development. By pairing on-site interaction with online continuity, Bridging Expertise also modeled adaptable PD formats that can respond to diverse institutional and geographic needs.

Overall, the program strengthened inter-institutional collaboration, supported knowledge exchange between practitioners, and contributed to EPPC's ongoing efforts to design professional learning opportunities that are accessible, relevant, and impactful for TESOL Türkiye members.



Research, Innovation, and Partnerships

EPPC also supported initiatives that extended beyond short-term training events. In 2025, the TÜBİTAK 4005-funded project Kırılgan Hayallerden Güçlü Yarınlar was accepted, focusing on trauma-informed approaches in English language teaching within the framework of the Türkiye Yüzyılı Maarif Modeli. The project aimed to explore innovative, research-based practices to address learner vulnerability and resilience in ELT contexts, with academic contributions and support from TESOL Türkiye.

Additionally, EPPC played a key role in launching international collaborations, including the TESOL Türkiye & NILE partnership. The collaboration was introduced through a webinar on learner autonomy, highlighting practical strategies to support learners in taking greater responsibility for their learning through knowledge, skills, attitudes, and habits.

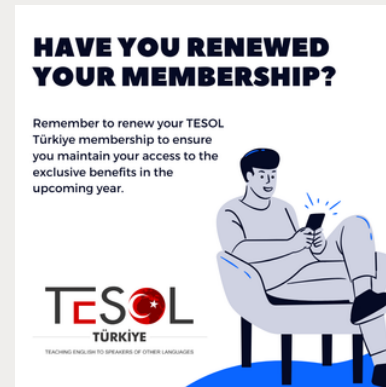

The council operates by overseeing the content and editorial processes of the TESOL Türkiye publications (PEMO & newsletters), managing the announcements on the website and social media accounts, and coordinating the promotion and communication of conferences, events, and organizations.

Social Media

Throughout the year, the council successfully carried out various activities, including publishing infographics on the process of becoming a TESOL Türkiye member, providing updates on affiliates (TESOL Türkiye is affiliated with INGEd, Free-access trainings provided by TESOL Türkiye and RELO, Ankara, Collaboration Launch Webinar between TESOL Türkiye & NILE), and grants (TESOL Türkiye Project “Kırılgan Hayallerden Güçlü Yarınlar” was accepted by TÜBİTAK 4005), announcing key details about the 6th TESOL Türkiye International ELT conference (e.g., dates, keynote speakers, sponsors, etc.), and promoting SIG events and webinars.

Website & Announcements

The TESOL Türkiye website, accessible at tesolturkey.net, is designed to offer a user-friendly experience while providing a wealth of updates and resources. A notable feature of the website is its dedicated section for the Professional ELT Magazine Online (PEMO). Guided by the PPC, this section was updated with insightful articles in January and July, showcasing the 14th and 15th issues of PEMO, which have significantly contributed to the professional development of ELT practitioners. The Announcements section served as a vital communication channel alongside social media platforms such as Instagram, LinkedIn, and X. Through this segment, the PPC regularly shared updates on association events, calls for volunteers for professional councils, new affiliate agreements, scholarship opportunities, and other key information, such as calls for papers, deadlines, and changes. This ensured that members could stay engaged and actively participate in the association's activities while taking advantage of various opportunities for contribution and collaboration.

2025 Overview & Activities

This report presents the activities carried out by TESOL Türkiye METASIG during the 2025 activity cycle. Throughout the year, METASIG focused on strengthening language assessment literacy, promoting data-informed approaches to evaluation, and exploring the responsible use of artificial intelligence in language assessment. The activities included webinars, a pre-conference event, and an annual professional development event, addressing both research-informed perspectives and practical applications in diverse educational contexts.

Activity 1

METASIG Webinar “Reimagining Language Assessment Education with ChatGPT” 21 January 2025

METASIG initiated its 2025 activities with an online webinar focusing on the role of artificial intelligence in language assessment education. The webinar was delivered by Dr. Aslı Lidice Göktürk Sağlam, Lecturer and Researcher in English Language Teaching at the University of South-Eastern Norway. The session explored how ChatGPT can be integrated into language assessment training to support the development of teachers' language assessment literacy. Drawing on a mixed-method study, the speaker shared findings from an online flipped assessment course involving 27 pre-service English teachers at a Turkish university. Participants examined teachers' experiences and perceptions regarding the pedagogical use of ChatGPT in assessment education. The webinar provided both theoretical perspectives and practical implications for incorporating AI tools into teacher education, while encouraging critical reflection on the opportunities and challenges of AI-supported assessment practices.

Activity 2

METASIG Pre-Conference Event

"Measuring and Comparing Instructional Effectiveness: A Data-Informed Approach Using ANCOVA" 17 April 2025

This interactive pre-conference session focused on the use of ANCOVA (Analysis of Covariance) as a statistical method for evaluating instructional effectiveness across multiple classes at the same CEFR level. Through real-life institutional scenarios, participants explored how adjusting for initial learner differences allows for fairer comparisons of student achievement. Using live data, the session demonstrated how ANCOVA can be applied in practice and how the results can be interpreted to inform instructional and administrative decision-making. A case study comparing seven B1-level classes was discussed, highlighting both the strengths and limitations of relying solely on quantitative measures. The session also emphasized the importance of combining statistical analysis with contextual and qualitative insights when evaluating instructional quality.

Activity 3

METASIG Webinar "A Comparative Analysis of AI, SpeechRater, and Human Scoring in Speaking Performance Assessment" 12 November 2025

This webinar examined the comparative performance of AI-based scoring systems, ETS SpeechRater, and expert human raters in the assessment of speaking performance. The session was delivered by Dr. Taner Yapar and Ali Emre Karagül and focused on issues of fairness, reliability, and validity in both automated and human scoring.

The webinar explored the extent to which AI-driven scoring systems align with human judgment and discussed their potential to enhance consistency and objectivity in speaking assessment. Participants were introduced to current research findings and practical considerations regarding the use of automated scoring in institutional and high-stakes testing contexts.

The session contributed to ongoing discussions on the responsible and validated use of artificial intelligence in language assessment.

Activity 4

METASIG Annual Event

Quality Assessment for Productive Skills: Current Trends and Practices

The event will bring together language assessment professionals to explore current trends, practical challenges, and research-informed practices in the assessment of productive skills.

The programme will focus on three main strands: improving writing rubrics for reliable and defensible scoring; practical and classroom-friendly approaches to assessing speaking; and evidence-based workflows for AI-supported assessment of productive skills. Through a series of hands-on workshops, participants will engage with both classical assessment frameworks and emerging AI-supported scoring practices. Sessions will address rubric design and refinement, speaking assessment practices, rater-related issues, and the implementation of AI-supported scoring models. Participants will be introduced to practical examples drawn from institutional contexts and will be encouraged to critically reflect on issues of reliability, validity, and fairness in productive skills assessment. The event will be held on 10 January 2026 at TOBB ETÜ Kırmızı Amfi in Ankara and will include contributions from experienced scholars and practitioners in language assessment. Discounts will be offered to TESOL Türkiye members, and participation will be free for SIG members.

2025 Overview & Activities

Activity 1

QUASIG ONLINE Webinar

"Quality: I know it when I see it. A crash course in quality in language programs." 3 December 2024

An online Zoom webinar titled "Quality: I know it when I see it – a crash course in quality in language programs" was delivered by Mehtap Çiçen and Ian Collins. The session focused on what quality means in education and, more specifically, on quality processes in language education.

Drawing on standards from a range of accreditation bodies, the webinar explored the concept of quality language education and examined how different quality frameworks approach common areas of practice. Key aspects of quality in language programs, including teaching and learning processes, assessment practices, and quality assurance mechanisms, were addressed through an interactive format.

The session was designed to be highly participatory, with guided questions, short activities, and discussion points encouraging participants to reflect on quality in their own institutional contexts. Through reference to multiple accreditation standards, participants were able to identify shared principles underpinning high-quality language education.

Approximately 60 participants attended the event and actively engaged throughout the session, contributing perspectives and insights on quality in language programs.

Activity 2

QUASIG Workshop

“Working with the Accreditation Standards: How to construct your responses.” 17 April, 2025

The presenters were the Joint Coordinators of QUASIG, Mehtap Çiçen and Ian Collins. This workshop used a fictional accreditation scheme (based around DEDAK, CEA, and EAQUALS standards) to explore how sites going through an accreditation self-study can approach responding to some key standards shared by all accreditation schemes (eg curriculum, student assessment, and planning standards). Participants actively engaged in various activities based around an extended case study, in which they identified key issues highlighted by various selected standards in an accreditation self-study and plan necessary changes to become compliant. By the end of the session, participants were able to analyze particular standards, evaluate a fictional site’s practices by reference to those standards, and plan responses to selected prompts from a self-study template.

Around 60 participants took part, contributing ideas and working through tasks in small groups. At the end of the session, they were invited to reflect on how they may approach the self-study process differently.

Future Plans

- A webinar on eligibility issues for programs applying for accreditation will be held on 13 January, 2026, with Didem Mutçalıoğlu and İlkay Bülbül presenting.
 - During the PCE event at the TESOL Türkiye Annual Conference, QUASIG will present a workshop on mediating quality through accreditation, with a focus on the ethical use of AI in accreditations and the benefits of micro-credentials in promoting quality in training.
 - QUASIG is also planning a one-day event to be held in September 2026, exploring further how to use AI tools in accreditation processes.
 - As the QUASIG team, most of us will participate in the QUAAS (Quality Assurance, Accreditation, and Standardization) Conference in May 2025, contributing through plenary sessions, training, and workshops.

2025 Overview & Activities

Activity 1

TEDSIG Webinar “Role of Professional Development in Performance Evaluation. (4th session of “TEDSIG Pedagogy Swap Series”), 19 March 2025

TEDSIG held the fourth session of its Pedagogy Swap Series on 19 March 2025 under the title “Role of Professional Development in Performance Evaluation.” The online session brought together 10 TEDSIG members for an interactive and reflective professional dialogue.

The webinar focused on exploring the relationship between professional development (PD) and teacher performance evaluation in ELT contexts. Guided by key discussion questions, participants examined how PD practices can inform and enhance performance evaluation processes, the role of reflective practices in supporting continuous professional growth, and ways of aligning PD initiatives with measurable performance outcomes.

Activity 2

TEDSIG organized a Pre-Conference Event on 17 April 2025 at Kayseri Erciyes University, prior to the 6th TESOL Türkiye International ELT Conference. The event aimed to bring together educators and SIG members for professional dialogue and knowledge sharing in the field of English Language Teaching. The programme began with registration between 13:00 and 13:20, followed by a Welcome and Introduction to TEDSIG session (13:20–14:00), during which participants were introduced to TEDSIG’s mission, activities, and areas of focus within teacher education and development.

The academic programme continued with a plenary session entitled “The Power of the Critical Response Process in Teaching & Learning,” delivered by Mary Scholl (14:00–15:00). The session focused on the role of critical response practices in enhancing teaching and learning processes and fostering reflective professional engagement. Activity 3

TESOL Türkiye TEDSIG & IATEFL TDSIG Joint Webinar, "Teacher Development Priorities in 2026", 17 December 2025

On 17 December 2025, TESOL Türkiye TEDSIG, in collaboration with IATEFL TDSIG, organized a joint members-only webinar entitled "Teacher Development Priorities in 2026." The online event brought together 29 participants from both SIGs for a focused discussion on sustainable teacher development and emerging priorities in the age of artificial intelligence. The webinar was hosted by James Taylor and Sammy Ming, members of the IATEFL TDSIG Executive Committee, and was structured into two complementary sessions.

In Part 1, "Engaging in Teacher Development," James Taylor explored how teachers can make informed and strategic decisions in their professional growth. The session addressed the development of Personal Strategic Plans, the role of Peer-Collaborative Development, and ways to ensure that teacher development efforts remain purposeful and impactful. In Part 2, "AI as a Catalyst for Sustainable PD," Sammy Ming examined the influence of generative AI on classroom practices and teacher roles. The session offered practical insights into interpreting AI-related policies, designing AI-aware assessment tasks, and facilitating meaningful classroom discussions around the ethical use of AI.

The joint webinar provided participants with valuable perspectives on future-oriented teacher development, combining strategic planning with practical applications of emerging technologies. The event further strengthened collaboration between TEDSIG and IATEFL TDSIG and highlighted the shared commitment of both SIGs to supporting professional growth in ELT.
